FEASTS OF THE WEEK:

<u>Ss. Cornelius & Cyprian</u> (Monday): Both lived in a time of turbulence in the Church in the third century. They were at the forefront of the debate on reconciling those who had denied their faith under persecution. They together struck a middle course and guided the Church onward by their writings and preaching. Cornelius, who attained the highest office of Pope, died in exile in 253, while Cyprian, Bishop of Carthage, was martyred in 258. Both saints' names appear in the Roman Canon (1st Eucharistic Prayer of the Mass).

St Robert Bellarmine (Tuesday): He was born in Montepulciano in Italy in 1542 and became a Jesuit. Later created a cardinal, he served briefly as Archbishop of Capua, though his greatest legacy is as a theologian and controversialist, especially in his defence of the Church against its critics. He was canonized in 1930 and the following year was declared a Doctor of the Church.

<u>St Januarius</u> (Thursday): Bishop of Benevento in Italy, he suffered martyrdom with his companions c.305 in the persecution under the emperor Diocletian. He is still greatly venerated in Naples where a relic of his blood is seen to liquefy on his feast-day.

Ss. Andrew Kim Taegon, St Paul Chong Hasang & companions (Fri): Andrew and Paul, together with 101 other Korean martyrs, represent the thousands of Catholics from all walks of life who were martyred in Korea before 1882. Andrew, born in 1821, was the first Korean priest to be martyred.

<u>St Matthew</u> (Saturday): Born in Capernaum, Matthew was a tax-collector (a despised profession) when called by Jesus. He is the first-named of the four evangelists and wrote his Gospel in Hebrew. He is believed to have preached the faith in the East after Christ's Ascension.
