MESSAGE FROM FR. JIM:

<u>TODAY'S FEAST</u>, brought forward from Monday, commemorates the visit of the Magi to the stable in Bethlehem, bearing gifts for the infant Jesus of gold, frankincense and myrrh. The word 'Epiphany' means 'revelation' or 'manifestation' and here refers to the revealing of Jesus to the world.

Such is the importance of this feast that in some countries, notably in the Eastern Orthodox Church, the full celebration of Christmas is delayed until this day. Also In Spain and South America it is traditional to exchange Christmas presents on this 'Three Kings Day'.

Unlike the custom in the material world, the Church's Christmas season does not end with Twelfth Night but continues until next Sunday when we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord. With this in mind, our crib and Christmas tree will remain in place until then.

2025 –As noted in previous newsletters, this is designated by **Pope Francis as a Jubilee Year and a Year of Hope,** when we are all urged to be 'pilgrims of hope' and encouragement to all with whom we come in contact, striving to bring reconciliation, peace and harmony in a world suffering from the impact of war, the ongoing effects of the Covid pandemic and climate crisis.
