MESSAGE FROM Fr. JIM

The Gospel of today provides one of those rare moments when Jesus is not preaching to the crowd, or one of the disciples, or even performing a miracle but speaks directly to the Father with a love and longing that should move us deeply. FEAST-DAYS OF THE WEEK:

<u>Ss. Marcellinus & Peter</u> (Monday): These fourth-century saints were members of the Church of Rome, Marcellinus a zealous priest and Peter an exorcist (one of the minor orders). They were beheaded during the persecution under the emperor Diocletian. Both saints are listed in the Roman Canon (1st Eucharistic Prayer).

St Charles Lwanga & Companions (Tuesday): These were Ugandan martyrs who met a cruel fate in the reign of King Mwanga (1885-6). Charles was master of the pages at the royal court, appointed after his predecessor had fatefully criticized the king. Numerous Christians, of several denominations, were put to death along with Charles on 3rd June 1886. All were canonized by Pope Paul VI in 1964.

St Boniface (Thursday): Born at Crediton in Devon c.673, he joined a Benedictine community at an early age and in 716 set out on his first missionary expedition to Frisia. Although this exercise proved unsuccessful, Boniface returned with papal approval and evangelized much of southern Germany. He was in due course named Archbishop of Mainz. In his seventies he embarked on a new missionary enterprise in Holland but suffered martyrdom in Frisia and was buried at a monastery he had founded locally.

St Norbert (Friday): Born in Germany in 1080, he lived a privileged life at court until experiencing a change of heart following an accident at the age of 35. Having been ordained priest, he founded the religious order known as the Norbertines. He became an archbishop in 1126 and overcame much opposition to reform the clergy and promote the unity and liberty of the Church.
