FEAST OF PENTECOST: Today we celebrate the great feast of Pentecost, the day the Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles like tongues of fire. Fifty days after Easter, the promise of Jesus is fulfilled: "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you" (Acts 1:8). And that power—God's own Spirit transforms frightened fishermen into fearless preachers, hiding disciples into bold witnesses, locked doors into open missions.

SAINTS'-DAYS OF THE WEEK:

St Barnabas (Wednesday): Living in the first century A.D., Barnabas is frequently mentioned in the Acts of the Apostles. It was he who introduced St. Paul to the Twelve and accompanied him on his first missionary journey. Although not himself one of the Twelve, Barnabas has long been honoured as an Apostle. Different accounts suggest he suffered martyrdom in either his native Cyprus or at Salamis in Greece. St Barnabas is listed in the Roman Canon (1st Eucharistic Prayer).

St Anthony of Padua (Friday): An outstanding theologian and preacher, he was born in Lisbon in 1195. He first joined the Canons Regular of St Augustine but after being inspired by accounts of the Franciscan martyrdoms in Morocco he switched his allegiance to the Friars Minor. Although he had a great desire to preach in Africa, he found his niche in Italy, becoming known as the 'Evangelical Doctor'. St Anthony is still popularly invoked as a finder of lost objects. He died in Padua in 1231 at the age of 36 and was canonized a year later. He is a Doctor of the Church.
